#### PLEASE BRING THIS DOCKET AND OTHER PAPERS WITH YOU TO THE PRESBYTERY **MEETING!**

Motions and resolutions from the floor MUST be presented in writing.

INTRODUCTION OF NEW BUSINESS – This is an item on the docket placed there to provide an opportunity for any member or commissioner to introduce matters that might not be a part of a Committee's report. This is your method of docketing a matter that you feel is important to the business of the Presbytery. Under the procedure, this new business will be referred to the Committee having cognizance over this matter. If at all possible, prior to the start of the meeting please give the Stated Clerk a summary of your item for new business so he/she can advise the Moderator.

**REMINDER TO CHURCHES** – If your elected commissioner or alternate is unable to attend a presbytery meeting, the Session may appoint another elder, either currently serving on the session or not, to serve as commissioner for that meeting. ALL visitors attending from your church need to either pre-register or sign in at the registration table at the meeting.

**HOW TO PRE-REGISTER** – Go to <u>www.psei.net</u>. Under the banner near the top of the page you will see *ministries* listed – put your cursor on that tab. On the drop-down menu, click on *Presbytery Meetings*. Here you will find the entire list of meeting documents. Read and print the ones you may want for the meeting.


2016 Budget 2nd Reading

Narrative

The budget committee's 2016 operating budget is being submitted to the Presbytery for the 2nd Reading.

Presbytery is facing the same reality as many of our congregations – falling membership. As you know, Presbytery has committed itself to helping congregations deal with that reality through various initiatives supporting churches. That commitment will continue. The budget calls for presbytery to reduce reserves by \$90,987 in 2016, but to maintain the current level of services.

The committee always takes a conservative path in building the annual budget — we assume less than we hope and work for. One of the base assumptions going into 2016 is that our membership will continue to decline. The chart below displays the path we are planning for.



Of course, that path also means a significant drop in per capita income, both to the churches and the presbytery. In fact, the budget expects a \$49,480 drop in per capita from 2015 to 2016. We are not, however, proposing an increase in our per capita rate in 2016. The GA/Synod/Presbytery combined per capita rate will stay at \$40 again this year. The synod has not increased their rate, GA has increased theirs by \$.05 – an increase the presbytery will absorb.

As in recent past years, our shared mission receipts are committed to supporting Camp Carew – expected shared mission income is \$60,000 and expenses for the camp are budgeted at \$74,165 – approximately a 2% increase.

For budget purposes, and subject to personnel committee action, salaries have been increased 2.2% over 2015. The various committee budgets are unchanged from 2015 with two exceptions. General Council's budget was increased for 2015 to cover the PCC search. That increase is not in 2016. Committee on Ministry requested \$8,000, down from \$8,700 in 2015. General office expenses are reduced from \$37,000 in 2015 to \$35,000 in 2016.

The "bottom line" is that the 2016 budget expects expenses to be \$90,387 more than revenues. The shortfall can be absorbed by reducing our fund balances/reserves.

#### The Commission of Trustees (COT)

It is **RECOMMENDED** that the Presbytery approve the following:

Tilden Presbyterian Church requests permission to get a loan for improvements to the foundation of the church. The amount of said loan would be a maximum amount of \$80,000.00 with an interest rate of 4.00%. The loan will be made at The Village Bank, 720 East Lyons St., Marissa, IL 62257. A congregational meeting was held previously to discuss this matter and was unanimously approved.

It is RECOMMENDED that Presbytery allow Bill McLean and Cindy Bean to drop their Presbytery cell phones and increase their monthly salary by \$50 a month to cover the cost of using their personal cell phones for Presbytery business.

## Commissioning Powers – COM

It is RECOMMENDED that the Committee on Ministry be commissioned to act on behalf of the Presbytery during 2016, thereby suspending Presbytery's Standing Rule I, I, 4 through 2016. This provision reads: *All actions of the COM are subject to review and/or correction by the Presbytery at its discretion.* The Committee on Ministry shall submit a report of its actions to the next Stated Meeting of the Presbytery. This will allow the Presbytery to live into one more year of experimentation with Regional Gatherings before deciding if we want to continue the practice and thereby make Standing Rule changes. Two-thirds approval is required.

# PILP Loan Request - Mt. Vernon, First

#### WHAT ARE THE FIVE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES FACED BY THE CHURCH TODAY?

- 1. Jesus said that the Sabbath is made for people, not people for the Sabbath, and that applies to the church as well; the church is made for people. However, not every person is the same and we understand that honest differences of opinion and in approach do exist between people of good will and that these are to be respected. We do that best, I believe, through our historic Presbyterian system of governance.
- 2. The task that we in the church face today is unchanged—proclaiming the Gospel—and the Gospel is about relationships between people and with God. In order to reinvigorate our delivery of the Gospel, we need to adapt our church life to the changes in our society that have come about since the reunion of the Southern and Northern streams in 1983. This world is radically different than the one many of us grew up in during the 20th Century. It seems more and more diverse as communications and other technologies are continuing to revolutionize many areas of our lives. Society and the church have changed and we can no longer automatically assume that most people are Protestant Christian nor can we assume that all members of the PC(USA) really understand what we mean as we say, "The church reformed, and always being reformed according to the Word of God."
- 3. We will regain energy through structural changes that will best match our member's energies and commitments to the specific tasks we are choosing to undertake. By continuing to move away from a fixed rule-based regulatory pattern of dealing with congregations and governing bodies towards one that is more relational and connectional, we will find more flexibility to meet particular situations. Put another way, an appropriate realignment of our denominational church structure will release our energies and allow us to better match the tasks we are doing with the resources we are given.
- 4. Continuing to develop leaders and adapt the presentations of our message to a changing society as we live out, proclaim, and share the unchanging Good News of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Continuing to enable mission, including person to person mission that develops relationships with other church members and those outside the church.
- 5. The Gospel is about hope and I am hopeful about this upcoming General Assembly and about our future.

- 1. Change while the mission and goals of the church don't change, we have to change our methods to accomplish them as the society changes around us.
- 2. Finding a meeting point between worrying too much about a congregation's size as compared to their "glory days" and remembering that one of the Great Ends of the Church is the proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind. While we need to be concerned about falling numbers, we should also be asking about how (if) we see the Holy Spirit being active in our churches.
- 3. Competition for time How do we compete with video games, after school, and even Sunday sports/band/theater, etc. for our children's time? Since the prestige level of being church members has fallen, how do we compete with Sunday golf games, family trips, secular groups, and shopping malls for the adults?
- 4. How do we reconcile those who think that "social justice" issues of peace, racial, & gender equality are just

part of a liberal agenda with those who believe they are in fact part of Christ's calling to us to advance God's Kingdom here on earth in our local communities and around God's world?

5. As our church buildings (and their parishioners) age, I have seen a figure that the average American church will spend 64% of its budget on building expenses and maintenance, rather than mission. What can we do about our beautiful, traditional buildings, which are getting older and need more maintenance just as our congregations which support them are getting smaller?

#### THE LOCAL CHURCH LEVEL?

I am currently serving as the installed Teaching Elder / Solo Pastor at First Presbyterian Church of Mt Vernon, IL. My responsibilities include preaching and leading worship weekly, administration: oversight of staff and ex officio member of church committees / teams, pastoral care, spiritual nurture, mission, community outreach including local ecumenical & non profit relationships, and fellowship.

#### THE PRESBYTERY?

Currently I am serving as the vice moderator of COM at PSEI and am a COM liaison for congregations in the southern part of the Presbytery of Southeast Illinois.

In Grace Presbytery I was the moderator of the Young Adult Committee: we promoted awareness of young adult needs, created presbytery wide spiritual nurture and fellowship events that all congregations could plug their young adults into while still being a part of their local congregation.

#### THE SYNOD?

Synod of the Lincoln Trails has a New Clergy Group program. I have been part of this program in learning and sustaining ministry in our synod along side other new clergy from our synod.

#### THE G. A.?

The final year of seminary at the 220<sup>th</sup> General Assembly in Pittsburgh, PA I was a TSAD. It was helpful having this experience to learn the process of General Assembly while helping others connect with technology or other needs that arose during the 220<sup>th</sup> General Assembly.

#### WHAT ARE THE FIVE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES FACED BY THE CHURCH TODAY?

- 1. Organization of our denomination: At the local level small, medium, and large congregations in rural, suburban, and urban areas support network; at the regional level response and support for presbyteries as they look at the role of presbyteries in a different context; at the synod level what is the purpose of a synod and how do they support their presbyteries in between General Assemblies; and at the national level what is the function of headquarters and the positions that we employ, what is the function of General Assembly, and what work do we need to amend or support.
- 2. Israel / Palestine and Ecumenical Relations: in the context of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. While I was at an ecumenical conference including faith leaders in the Abrahamic tradition at Chautauqua, NY I was consistently asked about the PCUSA's stance on Israel, Palestine, the Middle East, and Divestment. At the local level there is still questions about how the PCUSA can work with synagogues and Muslim community center's in the midst of divestment and how it has been communicated to the larger world.

- 3. 14-F and the Belhar Confession: living into what amendment 14-F and the addition of the Belhar confession mean for the PCUSA.
- 4. Peace and Reconciliation: in response to racial tensions in the United States (including Ferguson, MO; Balitmore, MD; and NY, NY) and the outbreak of gun violence and what it means for those left behind.
- 5. Poverty and Hunger: Responding to less government support for the disenfranchised locally, nationally, and globally through the PCUSA's mission efforts around Poverty and Hunger.

#### Lampstand Presbyterian Church, Decatur, IL Administrative Commission Report

Presbytery of Southeastern IL Stated Meeting November 19, 2015 Kemmerer Village, Assumption, IL

#### History

In July of 2014 the session of the Lampstand Presbyterian Church began discussions about separation from the PC(USA). Dan Rennert called Stated Clerk Cindy Bean on behalf of the session to inquire about the process for dismissal. Cindy Bean forwarded the Presbytery's Gracious Dismissal Policy and the session began reviewing it at its August 19, 2014 meeting.

At their April 4, 2015 session meeting the Ruling Elders voted unanimously to proceed with dismissal from the PC(USA). After a period of study and discussion the congregation voted on June 21, 2015, with a count of 131 yes and 2 no to seek dismissal. It was also determined that the congregation was feeling called to seek affiliation with the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians (ECO). On June 24, 2015, a letter was sent notifying the Presbytery of their wish to be dismissed to ECO. In July, 2015, the session began the application process with the Great Lakes Presbytery of ECO.

At the August 20, 2015 Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois

It was VOTED to elect an Administrative Commission which will have the powers to divide, dismiss or dissolve the Lampstand, Decatur congregation. The Administrative Commission will bring their recommendations to the Presbytery for approval. The official records of the congregation shall be retained by the Presbytery. All minutes of the Administrative Commission will be submitted and received by the Presbytery upon the completion of their work and will thereby become a part of the Presbytery minutes. The congregation wishes to be dismissed to the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians. The following are nominated to serve on the Lampstand Administrative Commission: Ruling Elders: Beth Bachtold, Decatur, First; Dan Rennert, Decatur, Lampstand; Susan Gant, Decatur, Westminster; Paul Saegesser, Mattoon (Trustees) and Teaching Elders: Jeff Grote, HR; Andrew Clark, Neoga.

An organizational Conference Call was held on September 23, 2015. Paul Saegesser was elected Moderator and Andrew Clark was elected Secretary for the Administrative Commission. The list of tasks that needed to be completed as a part of the dismissal was reviewed. The AC explored the challenges and opportunities for Dan Rennert who is both a member of the AC and the congregation. The AC agreed that they would ask the Lampstand session to appoint a like-sized negotiating team of 5 people to work with the AC and to have session's authority to approve actions taken towards the goal of a November 2015 dismissal to the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians. The AC authorized Dan to share the time line and recommendations with the Lampstand session.

On Wednesday, September 30, 2015, the Lampstand AC had a meeting with the majority of the session of the Lampstand church. The goal of a November dismissal was shared. The time line of tasks to be completed was reviewed. Rev. Jack Pitzer then informed the AC that by previous action taken by session that no money beyond the per capita owed in this calendar year would be disbursed. A session member then stated that if their decision was contested that legal action

would be taken against the Presbytery. The AC clarified with the session that per capita would be owed to the General Assembly and Synod in 2015 if the church was dismissed in 2015 and for one year beyond the year of dismissal regardless. The session felt that the Presbytery should absorb that cost. The AC reminded the session of the Presbytery's fiduciary responsibility to the denomination. AC members made an appeal for a gracious dismissal process, not an adversarial one. Since the session was not open to any discussion beyond their offer to finish paying this year's per capita, the meeting was closed with prayer.

On October 4, 2015 the AC met again to discuss their experience and reflection on the September 30<sup>th</sup> meeting with the Lampstand session. Dan Rennert reported about his conversation with Drew Smith from ECO and his perspective on the session's chosen course of action. A great deal of discussion was shared about the hope for compromise on the part of the AC members. It was agreed that Dan Rennert could not be compelled to have discussions with session members, but it was understood that he may choose to talk with them about ways to move forward toward dismissal.

On October 13, 2015 a brief conference call meeting was held and the news was shared that the Lampstand session would meet on October 20<sup>th</sup> and that Dan Rennert would be there. There was the hope that another meeting date with the session or a smaller negotiating team might be determined.

On October 28, 2015 a meeting with a negotiating team of four session members and the AC was held at the Lampstand church. After significant discussion, an agreement was reached and the proposed settlement will be taken to both the Lampstand session and the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois for approval.

Letters were sent to all active members of the Lampstand congregation instructing them how they could stay within the Presbyterian Church (USA) — transfer to one of the area PC(USA) churches or contact the Presbytery office to have their membership held in the Presbytery.

#### Actions taken by the Lampstand Presbyterian Congregation

#### 1. Change of name:

Their current name is Lampstand Presbyterian Church, Decatur, IL. Their new name will be Lampstand Church, Decatur, IL.

- 2. Secure a valuation of the church building and manse. see attached summary page from the 2008 appraisal that was done when the congregation formerly known as Woodland Chapel took on a mortgage and swapped properties with the Glad Tidings Assembly of God. This action was approved by the Presbytery. The congregation wanted larger facilities that would allow them to house the Great Banquet retreats and programs and enable church growth.
- 3. Removal of PCUSA emblems The only place the emblem occurs is on their offering envelopes, and the 2016 envelopes will be ordered without the symbol.
- 4. Church records to be read: The Session minutes are current.
- 5. Church records turned over to the Presbytery: They will be turned over to the Presbytery office (which will forward them to the Presbyterian Historical Society upon completion of the dismissal process. They will seek to make their own copies of the records.
- 6. Legal and Liability Limiting Actions

Being assured that there are no endowments and no investments with the Presbyterian Foundation, no loans or other encumbrances or other sources of incomes (such as a farm or oil well, etc.) the following items are a list of items that need to be completed or in process in order to be released from the PC(USA) and dismissed to the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians. The following items need to be complete in order to limit the liability of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois for the church that will formerly be known as Lampstand Presbyterian Church, Decatur, IL.

- Change the name of the church (see above).
- Secure a new Employer Identification Number using the new name.
- Secure a letter of tax exemption through the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians' 501c3.
- Notify insurance company of the change in name and denominational affiliation. This is particularly important for the Board of Directors Liability Insurance.
- Notify all vendors of the denomination affiliation change and new name.
- Give banks, utilities, vendors new 501c3 letter and new name and inform them of change in denominational affiliation.
- Change the title for vehicles, for property (church and vehicle).
- Change the by-laws to reflect the new denominational affiliation.
- Change the name and file new copy of 501c3 letter with any licensing companies/contracts like CCLI, etc.
- Publish any and all legal notices as may be required by law.

# Today, we bring the following information and recommendations to the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois for approval.

- That the Lampstand Presbyterian Church, Decatur, Illinois, be dismissed from the Presbyterian Church (USA) and the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois pending reception and enrollment by the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians and the Presbytery of the Great Lakes. To the extent lawful, all property, assets, membership, rights, privileges, responsibilities and liabilities will be transferred to the newly formed Not For Profit Church which will be known as Lampstand Church and will be under the jurisdiction of the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians conditioned upon the actions of Item 6 occurring by the dates specified conditioned upon accuracy of all representations and assurances, including those listed in Item 6 above.
- Authorize the Stated Clerk Rev. Cynthia Bean and/or Treasurer Paul Saegesser, officers
  of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois, to take any and all actions necessary to fulfill
  intent and purpose of this action, including signing deeds, contracts and other required
  legal documents.
- In the first quarter of 2016 Lampstand will make an \$8,000 gift to the Presbytery to be applied to presbytery operating costs as General Council designates.

- In 2017 Lampstand will make a gift of \$5,000 to PSEI which will be applied to the presbytery's shared mission giving designated for Camp Carew "Director's salary."
- In 2018 Lampstand will make a total gift of \$5,000 to the Presbytery which shall be given to three PCUSA mission causes 30% (\$1,500) to Kemmerer Village, 30% (\$1,500) to the Marion Medical Mission for shallow wells and 40% (\$2,000) to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA).
- Lampstand and PSEI will endeavor to complete all of the necessary work to achieve dismissal before December 31, 2015, to be coordinated with Lampstand's acceptance into ECO. Should the dismissal/reception be delayed until 2016, PSEI will incur out-of-pocket costs for per capita. In the event such a delay is caused by Lampstand or ECO, we agree to reopen our discussion.
- That the Lampstand Administrative Commission be dismissed with thanks.

#### Rationale:

First, after reflection (on the Listening Team report, the relationships formed in this process, etc.) it is the belief of the Administrative Commission that the Lampstand Presbyterian Church, Decatur, IL, is called to leave the Presbyterian Church (USA) in order to affiliate with a denomination more in line with their theological and Biblical beliefs.

Second, the Administrative Commission's work with the Lampstand Presbyterian congregation was guided by the following principles: consistency, pastoral responsibility, gracious witness, and openness and transparency.

- "In the recent General Assembly Permanent Judicial Commission (GAPJC) case, <u>Tom v. Pby of San Francisco</u>, the GAPJC authoritatively interpreted how the Trust Clause found in the Book of Order at G-4.0203 interacts with Gracious Dismissal Policies.
- 2. Believing that trying to exercise this responsibility and power through litigation is deadly to the cause of Christ, impacting the local church, other parts of the Body of Christ and ecumenical relationships, and our witness to Christ in the world around us, [the General Assembly] urges [congregations considering leaving the denomination,] presbyteries[,] and synods to implement a process using the following principles:
- Consistency: The local authority delegated to presbyteries is guided and shaped by our shared faith, service, and witness to Jesus Christ.
- Pastoral Responsibility: The requirement in G-11.0103i to consult with the members of a church seeking dismissal highlights the presbytery's pastoral responsibility, which must not be submerged beneath other responsibilities.
- Accountability: For a governing body, accountability rightly dictates fiduciary and connectional concerns, raising general issues of property (G-8.0000) and specific issues of

schism within a congregation (G-8.0600). But, full accountability also requires preeminent concern with "caring for the flock."

- Gracious Witness: It is our belief that Scripture and the Holy Spirit require a gracious witness from us rather than a harsh legalism.
- Openness and Transparency: Early, open communication and transparency about principles and process of dismissal necessarily serve truth, order, and goodness, and work against seeking civil litigation as a solution.

Third, the Appraised value of the property (2 buildings and parking lots) indicates the value to be in excess of 2 million dollars. However, the congregation owes more than 1 million still on the mortgage. The congregation had previously been able to make more than their monthly mortgage payments, but that is no longer the case. The Presbytery has no desire to take on the debt associated with this property. The costs associated with maintaining the vacant buildings until it is sold should be considered – maintenance, security, utilities, etc.

Fourth, since the session believes that no active members of the Lampstand Presbyterian congregation will wish to maintain their membership in the Presbytery and since we do know that some previously active members have transferred their membership to other PC(USA) congregations in the area in recent years, it was felt that dividing the congregation would not be feasible nor would the Presbytery want to take on the debt in order to use the facility for a New Church Development.

Fifth, the Lampstand congregation has a history of dissatisfaction with the votes taken at the General Assembly in recent years. In prior conversations it had been conveyed that if the denomination ever voted to redefine marriage they would have to seek dismissal.

Sixth, despite their differences with the Presbytery and the PC(USA), the Lampstand Presbyterian congregation has been continuous in their per capita giving and generous in their support of missions with connections to the Presbytery and the PC(USA).

Finally, believing that the Presbytery and the body of Christ would not be furthered by litigation nor possessing an empty building, the Administrative Commission recommends approval of the above items.

# Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois Stated Meeting Kemmerer Village, Assumption, IL November 19, 2015 Report from DuQuoin Administrative Commission

#### Updates:

- The Otis Elevator Corporation granted relief from the contracted as a result of Coralee Lawder's diligent and careful work.
- Additionally we discovered that the DuQuoin congregation failed to reveal that they were the beneficiaries of permanent funds from the Presbyterian Foundation. The Foundation has now been notified that the DuQuoin congregation is in the closing process, the money returned and the contingency beneficiary will receive the funds in the future.
- All of the session members resigned except two for various reasons including wanting to limit their personal liability.
- Members of the former congregation rejected an invitation to worship with the St. John's UCC congregation (who had rejected the Presbyterian's earlier offer to yoke) and instead formed a worshipping community in the vacant former funeral home across the street. They took items for their use and the motion to approve of the disbursement of those items is below. They do not want to affiliate with the PC(USA) because they are very angry and hurt.
- The previous offer to purchase the building from a local church was rescinded. Now that the property can be sold they will be contacted again to see if they are interested. In the meantime a congregation that is forming in the area has repeatedly expressed interest in the property and a site visit has been arranged.
- The Presbytery will insure the property under its policy with Church Mutual once the current policy expires.
- The Session minutes and Rolls and Registers have not yet been received by the Presbytery but we believe they are in the possession of the former Clerk for the congregation and believe that we will receive them.

The Macon Administrative Commission has consulted with one another many times through emails and had a meeting in Macon on November 9, 2015. Phil Smith, a member of the Commission of Trustees along with Stated Clerk Cindy Bean were in attendance.

- The Putnam Bond issue was resolved, the money issued and the Presbytery loan of \$3000 was paid back.
- The complete inventory list was distributed to the Presbytery and very few items were requested.
- A minimal commitment for Title insurance was secured. The building was appraised and has been listed with a realtor who specializes in commercial properties. The building is currently listed for \$160,000. The realtor cautioned that it usually takes 12 to 18 months for commercial properties to sell.
- The insurance is paid through May 2016, however, the policy may be cancelled and brought under the Presbytery's policy through Church Mutual.
- The personal property items that were previously approved for distribution have all been distributed except for the items for Centralia and Camp Carew. They will be told they must be secured by December 5<sup>th</sup>.
- The addresses for statements and bills for the bank utilities will be sent to the Presbytery office.
- The building will be winterized and the utilities turned off very soon.
- The session of the Macon congregation would like any proceeds from the closing of the church to be used to support the ministries of Camp Carew. The AC will make this recommendation to the Commission of Trustees who will bring a motion at the time that the proceeds are known.

#### Report of Rantoul Administrative Commission Presbytery of Southeastern IL Stated Meeting on Nov. 19, 2015 Kemmerer Village, Assumption, IL

#### Background:

A request was made by the Rantoul session and a vote was taken by the congregation at a meeting to proceed with closing of the church.

At its August 20, 2015, Stated Meeting, the Presbytery adopted the following recommendations of the General Council:

It was VOTED to elect the following to serve as members of the Administrative Commission to work with the Rantoul Church to investigate and determine the advisability of closing the church and to make the recommendation to dissolve the congregation if they determine that it be in the best interests of the church and the presbytery and

That the members of the Rantoul Administrative Commission consist of the following: Teaching Elders: Wade Meranda, Hoopeston (Trustee); Steve Shoemaker, HR; Cindy Shepherd, Validated Ministry; and Ruling Elders: Linda Smith, Tolono; and Marilyn Dewey, Rantoul.

The Rantoul Commission held an organizational meeting in Rantoul on September 16, 2015. Cindy Shepherd was elected moderator and Linda Smith elected clerk. Two other conference call meetings were held on October 13<sup>th</sup> and November 2nd.

A homecoming worship celebration was held on Nov. 8 with former pastors and members moderators invited to attend. A final worship service will be held on November 29<sup>th</sup>.

Options for transfer or sale of the sanctuary building and a manse, which has been rented for several years, is still being explored by the Commission. One appraisal has been done. The building has been shown to two groups who might, under favorable conditions, be able to use the building. The AC has made arrangements to secure, insure and maintain the building after the congregation is finished using it.

Cash on hand averages \$2500. Expenses after closure will be approximately \$800/mo, so the Commission recognizes the necessity of moving with all deliberate speed to divest itself of this property in the most advantageous way possible.

Should the building remain a responsibility of the Presbytery and the money run out, the AC may need to ask the Presbytery for financial help.

Also uncertain at this point is the status of three Church Mortgage Grants from the early 1950's, amounting to approximately \$20,000 in principal and much more in interest to

the Presbyterian Investment and Loan Program. The AC is in negotiation with PILP as to how the principle and interest will be handled.

All of the session minute books, rolls and registers have been located and will be turned over to the Presbytery when the congregation is dissolved. They will be read and forwarded to the Presbyterian Historical Society.

The members of the congregation have been informed that they need to transfer their membership or the Presbytery will retain them on the rolls until such a time as they have selected a congregation to which to transfer their membership.

All financial records, check books, savings accounts, etc. will be turned over to the Presbytery Treasurer when the congregation is dissolved. It is the responsibility of the session to ensure that all billing addresses are changed to the Presbytery office and that all vendors and institutions are informed that the congregation will closed.

The session compiled an inventory list and the AC approved the distribution of that list to PSEI churches and other PCUSA churches in a 60 mile radius from Rantoul. Requests for items from those churches are listed below. In an effort to distribute the remaining inventory items to be used in ministry the list will also be shared with the area Ministerial Alliances, service organizations, etc.

The AC reports that one item not listed on the inventory, a stained glass panel that was a gift from McKinley Presbyterian Church, was returned to McKinley, at their request and at their expense.

#### **CLOSINGS**

#### Mt. Carmel

Has not met. Moderator should call for a meeting soon.

#### Ridgway

Had organizational meeting where the task list was reviewed and certain items were delegated. Need communication from remaining members in order to move ahead.

#### CLOSING WITHOUT AC

#### Cairo

In 2006 the Presbytery voted to transfer the property and contents of the Cairo church to a Not-For-Profit "Presby Tips". This Not-For-Profit was formed in order to apply for funding that was available to Historical Sites and to have a place in Cairo to house the local historical religious items from area churches that had closed. The agreement allowed the congregation to worship in the building as long as they needed or wanted. The time is rapidly approaching when it will be time to formally dissolve the congregation with a final worship service. Watch for details for a service to be held in 2016. No AC is necessary because all the property and legal issues were resolved in 2006.

#### DISMISSALS

#### Herrin

Neither the congregation nor the pastor were received at the September meeting of the Rivers and Lakes Presbytery of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC). The process for receiving pastors was redesigned and they had a turnover in leadership for the group that completes the pastor examinations so Michael was not able to be examined for membership. The Presbytery now also has a policy not to receive churches until the pastor is received. This must have been a change in policy of which we were not aware because the Rivers and Lake Presbytery received the Morrisonville congregation prior to receiving their pastoral leader Jim Ferrill. This delay will cost the Presbytery per capita for another year and we may have to visit with the Herrin congregation about this development.

#### Kell, Romine Prairie

The AC had an organization meeting and a meeting with the congregation to work toward dismissal. The session has received the application for reception into the Rivers and Lakes Presbytery of the EPC, but does not have an examination date set yet. The cemetery and the congregation are both beneficiaries of permanent funds through the Presbyterian Foundation. Through diligent research it was recently discovered that upon dismissal the quarterly interest payments from the funds will go to a contingency beneficiary which is not the Presbytery. This means that even if we wanted to redirect the funds back to the church for support for the cemetery and/or the congregation we cannot do that. They will need to determine how they will support the cemetery and the church without those funds. Another meeting has not been scheduled with the Romine Prairie session yet.

#### Rationale:

We acknowledge the importance of Baptism in the life of a Christian and fully support the goal that every Christian should be strongly encouraged to acknowledge the lordship of Christ in her/his life with the act of baptism. Having said that, we also realize that the current wording in the Book of Order regarding who can partake in Holy Communion excludes those developing Christians who have not yet made the baptismal declaration. Children whose parents decided to not partake in infant baptism would be excluded until such time as (usually during the Confirmation experience) they themselves choose to be baptized. People who are new to the faith and are being nurtured by a congregation would also be excluded. In both of these cases it appears that the Book of Order would exclude these people from participation and require them to stay behind in the pews while everyone else goes forward to receive the elements.

We believe that few congregations actually follow the Book of Order in this regard. Holy Communion is routinely open to all who profess faith in Jesus Christ, with no mention of having to have been baptized.

We feel strongly that the Book of Order should be changed in the above ways so that we can walk arm in arm with all of our seeking brothers and sisters as we go forward to receive this holy sacrament.

Previous Form of Government stated "When any pastor or associate pastor retires, and the congregation is moved by affection and gratitude to continue an association in an honorary relationship, it may, at a regularly called congregational meeting, elect him or her as pastor emeritus or emerita, with or without honorarium, but with no pastoral authority or duty. This action shall be taken only after consultation with the committee on ministry of the presbytery concerning the wisdom of this relationship for the peace of the church. This action shall be subject to the approval of presbytery, and may take effect upon the formal dissolution of the pastoral or associate pastoral relationship or anytime thereafter."

It is RECOMMENDED that the Presbytery create the position of Pastor Emeritus as described in a Previous Form of Government.

It is **RECOMMENDED** that the Presbytery approve conferring the Pastor Emeritus status to HR Dan Whitfield for the Marion First congregation.

#### Commission Ruling Elder George Johnston to PSEI

It is RECOMMENDED that the Presbytery commission George Johnston to serve as Ruling Elder commissioned to any congregation of Presbytery at the invitation of the congregation's moderator to fill pulpits, moderate sessions, administer the sacraments and preside at weddings effective December 1, 2015 until November 30, 2016. Bill McLean will serve as supervisor.

#### Michael Duncan Incoming Questions:

The purpose of these questions is not only to examine you as a potential member of our presbytery, but also to help us get to know you. Please attach the first two pages of your Personal Information Form. Please also respond to the following questions in no more than two pages.

1. Tell us about your faith journey and what has led you into the parish ministry.

I grew up in an independent Christian Church in Southern Illinois in the 50s and 60s. We went whenever the doors were open...Sunday morning, Sunday evening, Wednesday evening. Youth meetings. I went to Church Camp each summer from the 5<sup>th</sup> grade through high school. Our ministers always took an interest in the youth and I was encouraged by ministers, my family and our church to consider the ministry. I went to college right out of high school thinking about professional ministry. I was married at the age of 20 right before my Junior year in college. It was tough trying to continue college as a young married couple, going to school full time and working full time. My grades began to slip, we ran out of money and I decided to enlist in the Air Force in April 1972. Several of my friends had enlisted and with the promise of the GI Bill, I felt it would be better to put college off for a few years. My first after Basic Training and Technical School in the Air Force was Williams AFB, AZ. While there we became very involved with The First Christian Church in Tempe, AZ. During this time I felt a strong call to ministry. In August 1974 I was sent on a remote tour to Osan AB, Korea. I grew to love the Air Force and felt that I wanted to stay in for a full career. While in Korea, I became involved with the base chapel and volunteering in orphanages. It was during my year in Korea I felt called to the Air Force Chaplaincy. I spoke with a Lutheran Chaplain about requirements for chaplaincy. He was less than encouraging, but I knew that was where the Lord was calling me. Long story short, I completed my tour in Korea in August, 1975 and was left the Air Force. I went back to college and received my B.S. from Johnson Bible College (now Johnson University) in the spring of 1977. Johnson was affiliated with the Independent Christian Church. From there I was accepted at Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and received my M.Div. in May, 1980. While at Midwestern I began serving a small Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). I started the process of switching from the Independent Christian Church to The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). I was granted temporary standing in 1980 and full standing in 1981. The Disciples endorsed me as an Air Force Chaplain and I served as an active duty chaplain until I retired on September 1, 1999. Upon my retirement from the Air Force I served the First Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) until July 31, 2013. I turned 62 on July 18, 2013 and took early retirement from the Church. We have 4 grown married children and 13 grandchildren. They are scattered across the U.S. and we wanted to see more of them. We enjoyed our time off with the grandkids, but I was getting a little restless. I began filling the pulpits for vacationing pastors in Metropolis. Word got out to Joel Jennings and Dave Park at Trinity that I was available for pulpit supply and they asked if I might be interested in serving them as pastor. We decided to try it for a few weeks to see if we might be a good match and decided very soon that it was. I'm grateful to be able to be able to serve them as Pastor. They are a wonderful group people.

- 2. Share with us your goals and dreams:
  - for the congregation to which you are being called

It's tough to say what our goals and dreams are. They are a very small group that have lost most of their membership recently. They are struggling right now to keep the doors open, but are committed to the Lord and His Church. I'm not really sure how long they will be able to keep the doors open, but one never knows. I've committed myself to them and am enjoying worshipping with them. They have a wonderful and talented musician. The adult Sunday School teacher is great! The group that is left love each other, the Lord and the Church.

- for your own professional growth, including plans for continuing education

I continue to study, pray, asking God's guidance. I follow the lectionary in my preaching. I have significant training through my civilian and military education. I would be open to attend continuing education events that the Presbytery sponsors.

3. What does it mean to you to be a faithful member of a presbytery? How do you plan to equip the congregation to which you are being called to be a faithful partner in ministry with the presbytery and the denomination?

I believe it's important to realize that we are more than the local church! That we are a part of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois. We pray for one another, work with each other to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Presbytery, as I understand it, is a group of ministers and elders that oversee the local congregations. Knowing that the Presbytery prays for us and are our brothers and sisters in Christ is comforting, especially for a small congregation like Trinity. I also believe, that it is our responsibility to pray for the Presbytery and keep you in the loop.

4. What particular training have you had in Presbyterian polity? How does Presbyterian polity guide you in your day-to-day ministry?

I have not had any formal training in Presbyterian polity, but I have read a great deal on the history and polity of the church. I also have worked side by side with PCUSA Air Force chaplains while I was on active duty and learned a lot from them.

5. What does it mean to you to be guided by the confessions of the Presbyterian Church (USA)?

Each Sunday at Trinity and also, when I was an Air Force chaplain, we read as a part of our worship one of the creeds. At Trinity, we rotate reciting the Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed or "A Brief Statement of Faith." This is one area that my background in the Disciples of Christ is different. We do no recite creeds in our worship, but that does not mean that we don't believe what the creeds say. What I find in my reading is: Presbyterians have confessions because of the Scriptural precedent of being confessional, because we believe faith has an intellectual component as well as an experiential one, because we are fallible human beings, prone to error, and inclined to forget who and whose we are. We need guidance and continual reminders about what we believe, because we are an evangelical church and our confessional statements serve as road maps to the Reformed faith.

6. What is your understanding of the significance of the Lord's Supper and Baptism in the Presbyterian Church (USA)?

The 2 sacraments that we find in the scriptures, basically same as my background. In the Christian Church we observe communion each Sunday and practice immersion, but like the Presbyterians we recognize all forms of baptism and don't require anyone to be rebaptized. While I was an Air Force chaplain I baptized some by immersion and some by sprinkling. I'm comfortable with either. Baptism unites the believer with Christ and welcomes him/her into Christ's Church. In communion, the bread represents Christ's broken body and the wine represents his blood. Communion is a time of remembering the sacrifice Christ made for his early disciples and us .. it is a time of renewal and remembering the covenant he made with us.

7. What are your interests or special talents which might enrich the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois? Attached is a list of presbytery committees - please list the top three on which you would you be interested in serving and tell us why you have chosen these three.

I did not see a list of committees. We are so far south, I'm not sure what I can do.

- 8. The presbytery plans regular new clergy events to help new pastors and their spouses become acquainted with each other and the presbytery. Are there topics you would particularly like included?

And now, their members have scattered, like seed on the wind, to bring gifts and resources to serve in new places. While these churches have now closed, their legacy of faithfulness persists.

In gratitude for that faithfulness over the years and for the ministries that brought Christ's gift of mercy and peace to others, we give thanks for the members and saints of the First United Presbyterian Church of DuQuoin founded in 1856; for the Macon Presbyterian Church founded in 1865; for the First Presbyterian Church of Ridgway started in 1832; for the First Presbyterian Church of Cairo founded in 1855 and the Rantoul congregation that after more than 60 years has two more weeks of worship. We ask God to bless the congregations that will receive the faithful remnant of these congregations as members and multiply the blessings as area congregations and social service agencies continue on the ministries in the name of Jesus Christ using the gifts given them by these faithful congregations!


