ACTIONS TAKEN BY THE GENERAL COUNCIL TO BE AFFIRMED BY PRESBYTERY:

RECOMMENDATION A

The Lord's Supper - 2016 Presbytery Meetings

It is RECOMMENDED that the Presbytery authorize the celebration of the Lord's Supper at all Presbytery meetings (including Regional Gatherings) in 2016.

RECOMMENDATION B

The Summer Camp Season at Camp Carew

It is RECOMMENDED that the Presbytery authorize the celebration of the Lord's Supper at Camp Carew during the 2016 Summer Camp Season and authorize Ruling Elder Dan Kingery to administer communion at Camp Carew. Dan has been trained to administer the sacrament.

RECOMMENDATION C

The Lord's Supper - Presbyterian Women

It is RECOMMENDED that the Presbytery authorize the celebration of the Lord's Supper at the Presbyterian Women events in 2016.

RECOMMENDATION D

The Lord's Supper - General Council & Committee on Ministry Retreats

It is RECOMMENDED that the Presbytery authorize the celebration of the Lord's Supper at the General Council retreat and the Committee on Ministry retreat in 2016 (if they choose to have retreats).

RECOMMENDATION E

The Lord's Supper - Kemmerer Village

It is RECOMMENDED that the Presbytery authorize the celebration of the Lord's Supper at Kemmerer Village during 2016 by Chaplain, Commissioned Ruling Elder Dorey Riegel (pending her approval of commissioning later in the meeting).

RECOMMENDATION F

Teaching Elders: Moderator Cindy Shepherd, Philo; Rodger Allen (or his appointee from CPM), Paris; Drew Holloway, Effingham; Ex-Officio (without vote), Bill McLean, Presbyter for Congregational Care; Cindy Bean, Stated Clerk.

Commissioning Powers – COM

It is RECOMMENDED that the Committee on Ministry be commissioned to act on behalf of the Presbytery during 2016, thereby suspending Presbytery's Standing Rule I, I, 4 through 2016. This provision reads: *All actions of the COM are subject to review and/or correction by the Presbytery at its discretion.* The Committee on Ministry shall submit a report of its actions to the next Stated Meeting of the Presbytery. This will allow the Presbytery to live into one more year of experimentation with Regional Gatherings before deciding if we want to continue the practice and thereby make Standing Rule changes. Two-thirds approval is required.

First Presbyterian Church, Effingham, Illinois Thursday, July 23, 2015

The General Council meeting of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois was held at the First Presbyterian Church, Effingham, Illinois on Thursday, July 23, 2015. The meeting was called to order by Moderator Mary Turner at 10:12 a.m. with prayer and meditation led by Bill Capel. A quorum was present.

It was **VOTED** to approve the agenda.

Minutes

It was VOTED to approve the minutes from the April 16, 2015 meeting and Notes from Retreat in May and Notes from Retreat in June.

Discussion Time:

Visioning Task Force

General Council discussed the recommended motions and guidelines submitted by Mary Turner and Chris Williams for the formation of a Visioning Task Force (VTF).

It was agreed that three or four members from each region would be invited to serve on this task force. A list was compiled of those who could make calls in their region to ask folks to serve on the VTF. Bill Capel - Salt Fork; Chris Williams - River to River; Mac Moore – Greater Decatur; Jan Hawkins or Maureen Clark - East Central; Joe Goeke - First Capital; David McNabb - The Bridge.

The funding for this TF would come from the \$500 in the General Council budget for Task Forces. The mileage would be reimbursed at the IRS volunteer rate. Rachel pointed out how much the congregations appreciate someone who listens to them and cheers them on in their mission and ministry activities. Those who serve on the task force should have excellent listening skills and naturally want to be advocates for the sessions that they visit.

The initial organizational meeting of the VTF would need to be a face to face meeting. The Task Force members need to make visits in pairs so that one can ask the questions (listener) and interact while listening and the other serves primarily as a note taker/scribe. The VTF needs to make sure the sessions know they are there to listen to them and not to defend the Presbytery nor engage in dialogue. The Task Force members need to start with worship and devotion at each meeting they have with sessions. The hope is that one listening time would be adequate for most meetings with sessions. There may be a need for more than one meeting if the first meeting is spent more with listening than garnering feedback on the Presbytery's mission statement and priorities.

Bill McLean asked what was the goal at the end of the Task Force's work? To determine what is the best direction

for the Presbytery as we support the work of the congregations and the Teaching Elder members. Bill McLean and Cindy Bean suggested that perhaps the Holy Cow survey could be administered to sessions in a follow-up visit after the initial listening and feedback session on the Presbytery's mission statement and priorities. This would allow the sessions to participate quickly and easily in saying what the priorities of the Presbytery could be in the next few years. This would substantially speed up the time it would take to get the end result and formulate our action steps. It was the consensus of the voting members of General Council to continue with the proposal as presented and not to add the simultaneous administration of the Holy Cow survey.

There were some concerns about asking the TF to take on the additional task of suggesting a new mission statement and Presbytery priorities. General Council determined that it would be best to observe the process and wait for feedback from the Task Force in the early stages before General Council decides the next steps and who would carry them out.

There was discussion about the importance of building relationships throughout this process. The Task Force members will lay the ground work for connectional relationships throughout the Presbytery. Committee on Ministry (COM) liaisons need to continue building on those relationships. There may be a need for the Task Force members to reach out to COM liaisons if there is an urgent unmet need for a contact and deeper relationship.

The docket for today's meeting called for the Council to develop a list of questions (open-ended and measurable) that we want the Visioning Task Force to ask Sessions in order to have consistency throughout visits. Janice suggested the TF should come up with creative ways to ask the questions. The Task Force should have a list of certain questions to ask the session along with a set of follow up questions.

It was VOTED to RECOMMEND that the Presbytery approve the following:

To create a Listening Team Task Force, with the following guidelines:

- 1.) Interview and listen to a majority of the Presbytery's Sessions, representative of our diverse geography, demographics, and theology, with the goal of achieving as close to 100% participation as possible.
- 2.) Present to these Sessions our current Mission Statement and Priorities, and to ask their opinions of their:
 - a. Effectiveness "Are we being successful in communicating and achieving our priorities and mission?"
 - b. Appropriateness "Is this what the mission of our Presbytery should be?"
 - c. Adherence to their own expectations of Presbytery "What do they think Presbytery should do and be? How can Presbytery best communicate with them?"
- 3.) Provide a written report to General Council at each General Council meeting on their progress (November, January and April) so that General Council can evaluate the results of their findings, and determine whether PSEI's Mission Statement and priorities are still appropriate and valid.
- 4.) Consist of a Moderator and 3 to 4 members of each Presbytery region, as well as the Presbyter for Congregational Care, with care taken to be as representative as possible in regards to Ruling and Teaching Elders, Men and Women, and small church vs. larger church membership. The Task Force will elect a Vice Moderator from amongst the Task Force members.
- 5.) Finish process of interviewing sessions by April of 2016 and to present final recommendations to Presbytery in August of 2016.

Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois Mission Statement: The Mission of the Presbytery is to connect, equip, and inspire Presbyterians as we walk with Jesus Christ

Priorities

- 1. Equip pastors and other leaders in congregations to help members become growing, vital disciples
- 2. Take a leadership role in working with churches that are struggling
- 3. Equip pastors and other leaders in congregations with strategies that enable them to reach new members
- 4. Streamline the Presbytery organizationally and administratively so that it makes better use of financial resources.

Task Force Guidelines

Listening Team Task Force

Function: In order to foster healthy relationships within the Presbytery, present the Mission Statement and Priorities of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois to member congregations' sessions based upon these interviews and the evaluate results and their findings.

Mandated by: PSEI General Council Tasks: Date to be finished

1. Organize the Listening Task Force, and create sub-teams to conduct session interviews September 2015

2. Interview a majority of congregations in each region April 2016

3. Evaluate responses June 2016

4. Present final recommendations to General Council July 2016

5. Present final recommendations to Presbytery August 2016

Task Force reports policy and procedural recommendations to: General Council

Recommended Task Force size: 19-24 members (3-4 from each region plus a Moderator); ideally, there will be two teams of two task force members for each region.

Assigned Staff: Presbyter for Congregational Care

Time Commitment: One organizational meeting; visits to 5-7 session meetings in a 7-8 month period (if sessions are open to it, small or similar congregations may be combined into one meeting); two or three meetings to evaluate findings and develop recommendations to General Council and Presbytery (these may be done electronically.)

Other information: Members will be representative of our diverse geography, demographics, and theology, and will have **excellent listening skills**.

Administrative Commission Updates:

To Close:

The Commission of Trustees (BOT) - Bill Capel reported.

DuQuoin – Everything was done to close except the elevator contract was ultimately not resolved. As a result the prospective buyers have withdrawn their offer. Otis Elevator has been unwilling to engage in dialogue. Members of the Commission of Trustees will be meeting shortly to assist the church to bring some sort of resolution to this contract.

It is RECOMMENDED that the Presbytery **RESCIND** the following motions:

DISSOLUTION – DUQUOIN

It was VOTED to dissolve the First United Presbyterian Church of DuQuoin, IL effective June 1, 2015, after the distribution of the personal property in the church.

SALE OF CHURCH -DUQUOIN- FAITH ASSEMBLY OF GOD

It was VOTED to approve the sale of the building and lots currently deeded to the First United Presbyterian Church of DuQuoin, Illinois for \$10,000 to the Faith Assembly of God, DuQuoin, IL and instruct the Presbytery's Commission of Trustees to administer/complete the sale of the property.

LEGAL DESCRIPTION:

City of DuQuoin, County of Perry and the state of Illinois:

1 part of lot four of block twenty nine of Keyes and Metcalf's addition to DuQuoin, Illinois, described as follows, to wit; Beginning 143 ½ feet west of the north east corner of the said lot four run south 248 feet, parallel with Washington St.; then west 10 feet more or less to within ten feet of the west line of said lot four; thence north, parallel with said Washington St. 248 feet to the south line of South St.; thence east along the south line of South St. To 7 feet, more or less to the place of beginning. Grantors are to give possession for the purpose of repair July 1, 1925 and complete possession of the premises Oct 1, 1925 except the reservation of space for the storage of household goods as agreed upon verbally which shall then revert over.

Lot Eight (8) in Block Ten (10) of Geo. T. Wall and Company's Addition to the City of DuQuoin, Illinois. Also a part of Lot Four (4) Block Twenty Nine (29) of Keyes and Metcalf's Addition to DuQuoin, Illinois described as follows: Beginning one hundred forty three and one half (1431/2) feet west of the Northeast Corner of said Lot Four (4) run South two hundred forty eight (248) feet parallel with Washington Street, thence West one hundred seven (107) feet more or less to within ten (10) feet of the West line of said Lot Four (4) thence North parallel with said Washington Street two hundred forty-eight (248) feet to the South line of South Street, thence East along the South line of South Street one hundred seven (107) feet, more or less to the place of beginning.

COMMISSION OF TRUSTEES

It was VOTED that the Commission of Trustees of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois shall take custody of all real and personal property, with the exception of the personal items listed below and on the subsequent inventory sheets that will be recorded at the next Stated meeting of Presbytery, both known at this time and any that may become know or received in the future.

Rationale:

In the final meetings with the congregation and session the Administrative Commission and the Stated Clerk were assured that the contractual obligation for elevator maintenance with the Otis Elevator Company had been or would soon be brought to a close. However, Otis Elevator refused to release the congregation from their obligation. After the May 7, 2015 Presbytery meeting, on May 13, 2015, the Clerk of Session, Ruling Elder David Peters informed us that the negotiations with Otis Elevator were not going well. That afternoon the Administrative Commission received a copy of the contract with Otis Elevator. The Stated Clerk of the Presbytery authorized the contract to be sent to the Presbytery lawyer, Dan Austin, for his review. The Stated Clerk informed the President of the Commission of Trustees of this action as well as the Moderator for the congregation. Dan Austin advised the President of the Commission of Trustees that it appeared to be a valid contract and that it was proper to require that the assumption of the maintenance contract be a part of the sale of the property. The potential purchaser of the property was subsequently notified of that obligation and has since withdrawn their offer.

Whereas the Administrative Commission was misinformed about the status of the contractual obligation and whereas the offer for the property was withdrawn and whereby it is believed that the officers of the congregation have a clearer right to negotiate the termination of the maintenance contract and obtain a free and clear title for the

property than the Presbytery, it is recommended that the Presbytery rescind the previous actions. This will allow the Commission of Trustees an advisory role in assisting the congregation rather than have the Presbytery take on the financial and legal obligations directly. Additionally, this will allow the Administrative Commission to also take on an advisory role and the AC can act on behalf of the Presbytery between meetings.

Macon – There have been issues with getting a bond liquidated. A number of the real property items in the church are going to be returned to members who donated them. Since it's illegal to return any donated items to its original owner, they will find an organization to give the items to. There a few issues to work out with those items and then the AC will work to find homes for the remaining items. They are seeking a local realtor to handle the sale. There are no known potential buyers at the moment. The sale may need to be turned over to the Commission of Trustees.

UPDATE:

Clerk of Session Connie Black and her husband have been working very hard with the Treasurer and members of the congregation and the Administrative Commission to resolve the Putnam bond issue. They are in the final stages and hope to receive the funds soon. As a result the promissory note has not been repaid and the congregation has not been dissolved. Additionally, the Commission of Trustees has not assumed custody of all real and personal property.

Rantoul – The AC has not had an organizational meeting nor met with the session. Inventory is completed and the property is being appraised.

Mt. Carmel – This AC was appointed some time ago, but then the session decided they would like to try and postpone closing by selling the manse. However, we were recently informed that they have changed their minds and wish to move toward closing. The AC will need to have an organizational meeting.

Ridgway – This AC has not had an organizational meeting nor met with the session. They should be doing so soon. Many of their real property items will be given to the New Haven congregation if they wish to receive them. (These congregations were yoked for years along with Shawneetown who broke the yoke a few years back.

To Dismiss:

Herrin – our part of the process is done except for the final paper work. Just waiting for the congregation to complete their rolls & registers and minutes books and to be examined for membership and to be received by the EPC. Additionally we are waiting for TE Michael Neubert to be examined and approved for membership in the EPC.

Decatur Lampstand – The congregation has voted to be dismissed to the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians. This will be our first time working with a congregation who wishes to be dismissed to ECO. There will be a learning curve about their process. It seems more detailed and time consuming than a dismissal to EPC. No word on Jack Pitzer's intentions for dismissal or retention in the PC(USA). AC has not had an organizational meeting nor a meeting with the session/negotiating team. They will have a recommendation at the August Presbytery meeting.

Kell, Romine Prairie – The congregation wishes to be dismissed to EPC. The AC has not had an organizational meeting nor a meeting with the session.

It was VOTED to elect the following to serve on the AC for Kell-Romine Prairie – Mac Butler, Moderator; Rachel Helgeson; Kerry Bean, Granger Odum, plus a 5th to be named.

Cindy will ask Janet Proctor if she would be willing to serve.

Financial Statement – Paul Saegesser presented a six month Financial Report along with the first reading of the 2016 Proposed Budget. The six month Finance Statement indicates the Presbytery is currently operating on a net total of \$51,824 over expenses, however the 2015 annual budget shows a \$54,780 deficit.

Paul also presented a list of churches that have not paid in their Per Capita in full. The uncollected portion of

that per capita will be written off at the end of 2015.

Paul reported that \$780.00 was collected for memorial fund of Dick Malmberg. Dick Malmberg served as the Presbytery's Executive Presbyter from 1999 to 2009. Dick passed away on June 21, 2015. **It was VOTED** that the Treasurer send the funds collected to Zephyr Point Conference Center in Dick's memory.

First reading of 2016 budget – Paul presented the 2016 Budget for a 1st reading. It was voted to present the 2016 Budget to the Presbytery for a 1st reading which indicates a \$90,387 deficit. Paul will draft a narrative and charts to be presented with the budget.

Paul noted that if the presbytery stayed on the present course, all of the available reserves will be depleted by 2020. It was **VOTED** to direct the Financial Management Task Force (Cindy Bean, Bill Capel, Wade Meranda, Paul Saegesser, Mary Turner, and Stacy Tate) to develop and present a five year financial plan for the Presbytery.

Evaluation of Regional Meetings

September/October regional meetings were optional. Bill McLean will put together a list of Regional Meeting dates and send them to the office so that the regional coordinators will consider holding a meeting that would include an opportunity to meet Bill and get to know him better.

Other Retreat ideas around Communication and Strengthening Relationship in the Presbytery

Rodger Allen will send out to the Teaching Elders (session moderators) the list of the activities of the Presbytery so that when asked "What does the Presbytery do for us?" they are ready to answer the question. The Council wishes to continue the pursuit of publishing a brochure and shooting a video that also explains what the presbytery does for the congregations as discussed at the June retreat. Bill McLean suggested putting a newsletter together about what the churches are doing and other events in the life of the presbytery. Janice stated they always appreciated the "Praying For You" postcard that the presbytery mailed out so we may want to publish a scheduled pastoral leader prayer list as a part of the newsletter. General Council, Presbytery and Synod highlights could be published. There could be a link to the newsletter on the Presbytery's web page and Facebook page. It was VOTED to work towards a monthly Email Newsletter. It will take some time to get organized for this task and we will want to beta test the newsletter (ideally by September) before it is fully launched. We may want to work for more frequent newsletters as churches and teaching elders contribute more content.

2016 Presbytery Focus on Worship and Preaching

It was VOTED to appoint Janice West, Carbondale; Laurie Williams, Paris, The; and ask Stacy Tate, Validated Ministry; and Jan Hawkins, Charleston to put together recommendations for programs.

The Committee on Representations (COR) - Dennis Hamilton reported that there are only five Presbytery committee vacancies. COR needs a TE in the Greater Decatur Region for 2016 an RE would be okay for overall committee balance. A name was given to Mary Turner to contact to fill the vacancy. As the committee prepares to fill the ballot for service that begins in 2016, a notice will be sent out encouraging members of the presbytery to serve. Dennis encouraged the members to assist him in filling the committees for 2016. Cindy Bean will contact Ruling Elder Cynthia Lawder, Chester to see if she wants to continue to serve on General Council since she has not attended a meeting. The next meeting for COR will be on September 10th at 10 am in Effingham.

The Personnel Committee (PC)

In agreement with the Personnel Committee Moderator's request, **It was VOTED** to cancel staff evaluations on September 15 in Effingham and reschedule them for March 15, 2016, in line with the newly adopted Manual of Administrative Operations. This will allow Personnel to make salary change recommendations to the General Council well in advance of the budgeting process.

Recommendation regarding the Camp Director position.

Chris Williams, Camp Board Moderator, was contacted by the Personnel Committee for a recommendation regarding the length for funding of a full-time agreement for the Camp Director. Based on conversations around the financial projections for the Presbytery, Chris thought at this time the Presbytery could commit to a two year full time agreement. **It was VOTED** that if the way be clear, the Camp Carew Director's Agreement be renewed for two years, effective January 1, 2016.

The Camp Carew Budget is needed in the Presbytery office by August 3 for a first reading. Chris was asked for an update on the Board of Director's pursuit of taking on some of the Methodist Camp property nearby in order to have a bigger facility to handle larger groups and programs. Unfortunately, that process revealed that not only is the Methodist Camp required to return the land to its pristine condition (removal of all buildings) when they cease to use the land, but so is the Presbytery. Chris suggested that the presbytery should think outside the box as they seek to continue the Camp Carew ministry. In thinking about the financial relationship of the Presbytery with Camp Carew it was reaffirmed that the Camp will always rely on Presbytery and outside funding – Camps are seldom self-sustaining ministries.

It was suggested to have a joint meeting between Camps and Conferences Board of Directors and General Council on August 20th at 2pm and that Chris will moderate the meeting. The goal is to strengthen the working relationship between the two governing bodies and to be sure that there are clear and open lines of communication with regards to plans for the future and finances. Chris reported that the Camp Board's annual steak fry for Board members, staff and volunteers will be held on September 4th.

The Committee on Preparation for Ministry (CPM) - Rodger Allen reported.

David Peters, DuQuoin, First will be enrolled as an Inquirer. The Special Administrative Commission met with Rachel Riggle and she will be enrolled as a Candidate. Sarah Montgomery will possibly be enrolled as Candidate following a meeting with CPM and examination on the floor of Presbytery in August.

The Presbyterian Women (PWP) – No report.

The Committee on Ministry (COM) – Rachel Helgeson, COM Vice Moderator, shared with GC the changes being made between congregations and some of the Teaching Elders in the presbytery. She also reviewed some of the ethical guidelines Teaching Elders must follow when they dissolve their relationship with a church. Cindy announced there are 45 of 93 sessions who have not had their minutes read even though the seven planned reading sessions are now completed. She may need to schedule one for reading date in hopes of getting the remaining sessions in compliance with the Book of Order requirement.

COM is recommending to Presbytery that "vacation" be defined as 4 weeks (Monday – Sunday), including 4 Sundays. They will also have a recommendation for Presbytery approval for minimum salary and a suggested Cost of Living Adjustment.

ARMSS – No report.

Report from Worship Planning Team - Cindy Bean reported.

July 29th is date to plan for August and November meetings. They are thinking of a Holy Humor service and Camp Songs for August and Prayer Stations in November.

It was AGREED to endorse these planning ideas.

The Moderator - Dennis Hamilton announced he has done one installation this year.

Synod Commissioners - Laurie Williams distributed the Synod of Lincoln Trails: Woven Together flyer that summarizes the Synod of Lincoln Trails meeting that was held on June 27th in Philo, IL. One of the topics in the flyer discusses combining three of the Synods into one. Synod of Lincoln Trails is NOT recommending merger. Bill

McLean announced there will be two Synod meetings held in this presbytery and one meeting in Indiana for 2016.

The Presbyter for Congregational Care - Bill McLean reported.

Bill has been here a little over three weeks and has appreciated the warm welcome he has received. His wife, Kate will begin her new job next month and they will be moving inside the presbytery next month as well. Bill will be attending the Big Tent event in Knoxville, TN. Bill hopes to continue the Presbytery's practice to have the Presbyter fill the pulpit on the Sunday after (or close to) a pastoral departure. His first preaching engagement will be on Sunday, August 2nd at Pinckneyville and Murphysboro.

The Stated Clerk - Cindy Bean reported.

Proposed Docket for August Stated Meeting

It was VOTED to RECOMMEND that the Presbytery approve the docket as prepared by General Council with adjustments made by the Stated Clerk. This will be a half day meeting with the option for recreational activities at the Camp and in the surrounding areas. A lunch will be provided at the Camp.

November Stated Meeting

Board of Pensions Regional Representative Ed Thompson has requested time on the November Stated Meeting Docket.

There will be an Overture from Urbana, First Church in either in August or November regarding the language in the Directory for Worship in the Book of Order regarding communion.

General Council and Camps and Conference Board of Directors Joint Meeting Thursday, August 20, 2015 Camp Carew, Makanda, Illinois

The meeting was called to order with prayer by Camps and Conferences (CC) Moderator Chris Williams at 2:05 pm.

Chris asked everyone to introduce themselves and share their connection with General Council or Camp Carew.

Chris announced that the purpose of the meeting was to develop a better relationship between Presbytery and Camp Carew. He thought the communication between the two needed to be better. Chris asked how could Presbytery support Camp Carew? Where do they see the camp in five years? What is the goal/vision of the camp? What does Presbytery and Camp need to do to come together and settle their differences?

Dan shared the need for the camp and the importance it is for the children who attend - it is life changing, it gives the kids a sense of hope, and it's a place where kids can come and feel safe.

One of the goals for the camp is to be a more integral part in youth ministry.

The Camp Board felt that since Dan's been at Camp Carew, it being seen in another light. Dave Rozanski stated that he didn't feel that Presbytery cared about the Camp until Dan Kingery became Director.

How can the information about Camp Carew be communicated to the churches better? Some thought there was an identity problem because most people don't know about Camp Carew. It was suggested that the Board members visit the churches and do presentations about the Camp. It was also suggested that they asked the children who've attended camp in the past to be an advocate for the Camp. Maybe show the summer camp video from todays' Presbytery meeting as a way of encouraging them to send their children.

It was suggested that maybe the camp van could go and pick up children who live far away who might not be able to attend the camp unless they are picked up.

Dan announced that the summer camp programs do not cover the camp's expenses. Dan thought by combining the Methodist Camp with Camp Carew, they could house 300 campers. The camp needs an income of at least \$150,000 to sustain the camp's expenses. Dan is focusing more on getting outside groups to rent the camp in hopes it would alleviate some of the camp's expenses.

Camp Carew felt that Presbytery poured most of the Mission Funds into the Camp when Dan became director. Then last year, the support to Camp Carew was cut and that hurt the camp. The camp was informed that although the support has been cut, the Presbytery still pays the Camp Directors' \$66,813 salary.

Dan felt the Camp should be their own non-for-profit entity and distance themselves from the Presbytery. The Fish and Wildlife says Presbytery cannot shut down the camp. If they do, everything the Presbytery added to the camp will need to be removed. It was asked if the Camp had checked with the Presbyterian Foundation to see if they did separate from Presbytery would the Foundation continue to support the Camp. Dan had not checked into that yet. Cindy shared with Dan that if they enter a contract with the neighboring Methodist camp, necessary steps will need to be taken to ensure the terms with the Presbyterian Foundation are met.

Chris stated there wouldn't be a solution today but the ideas will improve a better relationship between the Presbytery and Camp Carew.

Chris then asked what did the Camp need from Presbytery to be successful. How can Presbytery support Camp Carew and vice versus? Help invigorate the churches to attend Camp. Pursue and explore what a partnership should look like between Presbytery and Camp Carew.

Dave Rozanski felt this meeting was definitely needed. He did however, think the Board would need an invitation from the churches before they could visit them. An announcement will go to the churches to let them know Camp Carew is available to come share information about the camp with them. Dan stated that he has visited at least 59 of the churches.

Everyone realized they had a long way to go and there's a need to work on building a trust between the Presbytery and Camp Carew.

The meeting closed with prayer at 3:27 with prayer by Bill Capel.


2016 Budget 2nd Reading

Narrative

The budget committee's 2016 operating budget is being submitted to the Presbytery for the 2nd Reading.

Presbytery is facing the same reality as many of our congregations – falling membership. As you know, Presbytery has committed itself to helping congregations deal with that reality through various initiatives supporting churches. That commitment will continue. The budget calls for presbytery to reduce reserves by \$90,987 in 2016, but to maintain the current level of services.

The committee always takes a conservative path in building the annual budget – we assume less than we hope and work for. One of the base assumptions going into 2016 is that our membership will continue to decline. The chart below displays the path we are planning for.



Of course, that path also means a significant drop in per capita income, both to the churches and the presbytery. In fact, the budget expects a \$49,480 drop in per capita from 2015 to 2016. We are not, however, proposing an increase in our per capita rate in 2016. The GA/Synod/Presbytery combined per

capita rate will stay at \$40 again this year. The synod has not increased their rate, GA has increased theirs by \$.05 – an increase the presbytery will absorb.

As in recent past years, our shared mission receipts are committed to supporting Camp Carew – expected shared mission income is \$60,000 and expenses for the camp are budgeted at \$74,165 – approximately a 2% increase.

For budget purposes, and subject to personnel committee action, salaries have been increased 2.2% over 2015. The various committee budgets are unchanged from 2015 with two exceptions. General Council's budget was increased for 2015 to cover the PCC search. That increase is not in 2016. Committee on Ministry requested \$8,000, down from \$8,700 in 2015. General office expenses are reduced from \$37,000 in 2015 to \$35,000 in 2016.

The "bottom line" is that the 2016 budget expects expenses to be \$90,387 more than revenues. The shortfall can be absorbed by reducing our fund balances/reserves.

Bill received his bachelor's degree in political science from UNC-CH, and an MBA from Georgia Southern University. Bill spent almost six years at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in Atlanta, GA working on public health policy, management, budget and personnel issues, including serving part of this time as an Assistant Branch Chief.

While at the CDC he completed the federal government's two year management development program, known then as the Presidential Management Internship program.

When Bill discerned a call to ordained ministry he moved to New Jersey, where he received his Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary.

His service as pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Delphi began in October 2007. During his service in Delphi, this small congregation completed a multiyear missional transformation journey and continues to explore how to join with other area Presbyterian congregations in creative cooperative ministry.

The invitation to the Lord's Supper is extended to all who have been baptized, remembering that access to the Table is not a right conferred upon the worthy, but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. In preparing to receive Christ in this Sacrament, the believer is to confess sin and brokenness, to seek reconciliation with God and neighbor, and to trust in Jesus Christ for cleansing and renewal. Even one who doubts or whose trust is wavering may come to the Table in order to be assured of God's love and grace in Christ Jesus.

Proposed changes:

The invitation to the Lord's Supper is extended to all <u>WHO SEEK THE PRESENCE OF JESUS CHRIST</u>, remembering that access to the Table is not a right conferred upon the worthy, but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. In preparing to receive Christ in this Sacrament, the believer is to confess sin and brokenness, to seek reconciliation with God and neighbor, and to trust in Jesus Christ for cleansing and renewal. Even one who doubts or whose trust is wavering may come to the Table in order to be assured of God's love and grace in Christ Jesus.

b. **[REMOVE "BAPTIZED"]** Children who are being nurtured and instructed in the significance of the invitation to the Table and the meaning of their response are invited to receive the Lord's Supper, recognizing that their understanding of participation will vary according to their maturity. (W-4.2002)

Rationale:

We acknowledge the importance of Baptism in the life of a Christian and fully support the goal that every Christian should be strongly encouraged to acknowledge the lordship of Christ in her/his life with the act of baptism. Having said that, we also realize that the current wording in the Book of Order regarding who can partake in Holy Communion excludes those developing Christians who have not yet made the baptismal declaration. Children whose parents decided to not partake in infant baptism would be excluded until such time as (usually during the Confirmation experience) they themselves choose to be baptized. People who are new to the faith and are being nurtured by a congregation would also be excluded. In both of these cases it appears that the Book of Order would exclude these people from participation and require them to stay behind in the pews while everyone else goes forward to receive the elements.

We believe that few congregations actually follow the Book of Order in this regard. Holy Communion is routinely open to all who profess faith in Jesus Christ, with no mention of having to have been baptized.

We feel strongly that the Book of Order should be changed in the above ways so that we can walk arm in arm with all of our seeking brothers and sisters as we go forward to receive this holy sacrament.
